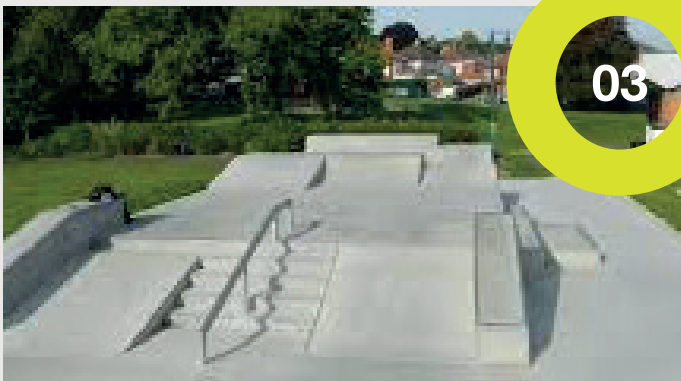

Whether you arrive here by car (there is ample free parking) or on foot from the Wales Coast Path, Greenfield Dock is a great place to explore. Though it remains an important place of work, the area is now quiet and peaceful, offering beautiful and expansive views across the Estuary

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A little history & culture...

St Winefride's Chapel and Holy Well & Museum. The holy well at St Winefride's has been a place of pilgrimage since at least 1115. It is said to spring from the spot where 7thC Welsh abbot St Beuno brought his niece Winefride back to life.

The Museum occupies two rooms on the first floor of the former Custodian's House. The Museum houses an impressive collection of rare and interesting items, all related in some manner to St Winefride and the Holywell pilgrimage.
